1- The PIARC Program and international seminars

PIARC (the World Road Association) is a non-political, non-profit organization whose mission consists of organizing forums, disseminating good practices and promoting efficient tools in the aim to assist and support the decision -making in the field of roads infrastructure and transport.

As part of its activities, and since 1999, the Association has been holding a program of international seminars that reinforces its worldwide presence, its responsiveness to the needs of developing countries and those in transition, and promotes the results of the Association's work more widely in these countries.

2- Technical Committee 2.1: Urban Mobility

Cities deliver a lot of services (jobs, education, culture, hospitals, ...) not only for citizens, but also for rural communities around the cities. Technical Committee 2.1 "Mobility in Urban Areas" focuses on inhabitant's mobility needs in the commuting areas in order to make sure that all transportation needs in relation with the services delivered by cities will be taken into consideration. It will take into account the complexity of urban areas (integration with land planning, multimodality, public support, new mobility modes).

The work of the technical committee TC2.1 "Urban mobility" revolves around the following issues:

- 2.1.1 Accessibility and mobility facing land use in urban and peri-urban development
- 2.1.2 Integrated transportation systems, multimodality
- 2.1.3 Evaluating impacts of new mobility in urban and peri-urban areas

3- Seminar objectives

With urban sprawl, the demand for mobility is increasing, resulting in congestion, pollution, and degradation of the quality of life in cities, which is becoming a public policy issue. Mass transportation is one of the solutions to decrease the excessive use of cars. The Covid-19 pandemic and repeated lockdowns have had a positive effect, roads have been emptied and people have rediscovered walking and cycling. This reduction in cars on the road has led to a sharp reduction in pollution.

With the return of cars and the lack of appropriate infrastructure, cycling in the city may seem unsafe especially with the dominance of cars' presence on the roads. However, this first experience of cycling has marked the minds and appears to have been deeply appreciated.

With this in mind, this seminar is being held to exchange and present the necessary recommendations so that effective solutions and countermeasures can be proposed, taking into account the specificities of each city: financial, logistic, existing networks, strategies already in place, etc.

4- Who attends the seminar?

The PIARC International Seminar on Urban Mobility is intended for local authorities, administrations, the private sector and those responsible for road traffic and road safety, design engineers and design consultants, road network administrators, contractors, control and technical assistance consultants, academics, researchers and engineering students with an interest in the subject of Urban Mobility, and experts in other fields of expertise related to Urban Mobility.



5-LOCATION AND DATES OF THE SEMINAR

The seminar will take place from November 23 to 25, 2022, in Tunis, Tunisia.

Tunisia is located in the Maghreb region of North Africa. It is bordered by Algeria to the west and southwest, Libya to the southeast and the Mediterranean Sea to the north and east. The country also shares maritime borders with Italy. The country's surface area is approximately 164,000 km² and its coastline extends for about 1,148 km. The capital of Tunisia is the city of Tunis. Tunisia is a fascinating touristic destination, rich with intriguing attractions.

The seminar will be organized in several sessions and will address several of the topics included in the following preliminary program . The panels will be conducted over the three days of the seminar and , each session will include several presentations by members of the technical committee 2.1 and by Tunisian and international experts . 

Travel and Transportation

Travelers must provide their COVID-19 vaccination passport before boarding. In case of non-vaccination, PCR 48h before departure is mandatory.

In general, the following documents are required to apply for a visa for Tunisia:

- Original passport with a minimum validity of 6 months ,
- Visa fees
- Supporting documents if applicable.
- Fully filled out application form

To be noted that, procedures, requests and delays may vary from one country to another. Therefore ,please consult with your embassy or consular office to obtain complete information.
